Sports for school Athlete Event

On Monday 16th October 23, the whole of All Saints', took part in a Sports for Schools fundraising event. Sports for Schools is a social enterprise that brings the country's top athletes into schools to encourage children (and teachers!) to be more active. The athlete we were lucky to have in school was **Joe Roebuck**, a GB Olympic swimmer, ten times British Champion, double commonwealth medallist and London 2012 Olympic semi-finalist. He ran a fitness circuit with every class before leading an inspiring whole school assembly.

A **BIG THANK YOU** to everyone who helped with the fundraising. The school raised a **MASSIVE £1690** for the school which will be put towards new PE equipment. We will let you know of these purchases when we have decided.


Own Books Announcement





Library Services Offering First Language And Dual Language Books


Extensive EAL research shows that children who are proficient in reading in their first language, make accelerated progress in EAL.

MANAGING ANXIETY AROUND SCHOOL

School is a place where young people often experience anxiety for several reasons. Some people may worry about making friends or fitting in, have difficulty understanding school work, or feeling exam pressure.

School-Related Anxiety Warning Signs:

- Not sleeping well
- Feeling sick or complaining of butterflies in their stomach
- Not wanting to get out of bed in the morning
- Increased anger or upset at school or home

It is common that young people show symptoms of school-related anxiety in evenings or early mornings before school. The first step to supporting your child is to understand what is causing these feelings.

Top tip: Some children may find it difficult to be asked direct questions about their feelings. Try creating a mind map with them about school, including everything that is on their mind.

Strategies to Try at Home:

Keep a record of patterns in behaviours to share with the school's Mental Health Lead

Create a self-soothe box with Items that your child finds relaxing

Breathing exercises

Create a morning routine

Recognise small achievements
