On behalf of all the teachers and staff, I would like to say how proud we are of all the children and how well they have coped since lockdown 3 commenced. The zoom children have been so focused and enthusiastic to learn and the keyworker children have adapted well to having a range of teachers as well as a different learning environment with a different mix of children.

We are very pleased with how the online lessons are going, thank you all for working so hard with your children. Teaching on Zoom isn't the easy option and I very proud of our staff for adapting so well and innovating to the challenges this situation presents us - a real growth mindset in action. We have decided on 'Live Lessons' because we are able to adapt the next session to any misconceptions that may have arisen, and extend learning when applicable. Children also get the advantage of being able to keep in touch with their teacher and classmates, keeping our community spirit going. At the start of every session, the teacher spends some time feeding back to the children on work that has been emailed; this is the most effective way of improvement for children. We also acknowledge all emails, focusing on individual areas to improve on where needed.

Thank you for your patience with us whilst we have been putting new systems in place to support children of key workers and vulnerable children, as well as overcoming any technical issues with remote learning. Staff have appreciated all the kind messages of support and positive feedback from families and we really hope we will be able to reopen fully in the not too distant future.

# FREE SCHOOL MEAL ENTITLEMENT AND PUPIL PREMIUM REGISTRATION

Due to the current situation with COVID-19, we are aware that Parent and Carer's circumstances may have changed. Depending on your family/household income, your child may be eligible for **Free School Meals.** All children in Infant School receive a free hot meal at lunch-time, but this is a separate entitlement.

If your child qualifies for Free School Meals they will also receive **Pupil Premium funding.** This entitles your child to free or subsidised school trips, music lessons, school uniform and help to access after school clubs. Registering children for Free School Meals and subsequently Pupil Premium also enables the school to claim additional funding to improve resources for your child in school.

If you can answer yes to any of the following questions you may be eligible:

- •Is your joint family **income** under £16,190 per year?
- Are you in receipt of any of the **benefits** listed below?
- •Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- •Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- •Support from NASS (National Asylum Support Service) under part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- •the guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- •Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit run-on
- Universal Credit.
- •Are you or your partner a member of the Armed Forces?

All reception, year 1 and year 2 children in state-funded schools can have a free hot meal at lunchtime. This is known as 'Universal Entitlement'. If you think you are eligible for any of the criteria above we recommend that you still apply. This will mean that your child's school does not miss out on important funding. It may also mean your child will continue to receive free meals after the end of year 2.
