Parking Issues Addressed

Dear Parents/guardians

It has recently been brought to our attention that over recent weeks there has been a number of issue regarding parking at the beginning and the end of the school day that has led to a number of heated discussions between local residents and parents/guardians over the matter.

We would like to ask that if there are any issues in the future between local residents and people coming to pick up children that you report it to us on 101 so we can record this appropriately. Furthermore, as a reminder, you must not park:

On double/Single yellow lines

On pavements Opposite or within 10m of a Junction

Where is causes an obstruction On Zig-zags

On a dropped kerb.

This could land you with a fixed penalty notice for causing an obstruction on the highway. Please take this as a reminder regarding your responsibility to park appropriately on the highway.

Dear Parents and Carers

Following a recent online meeting with local residents of Dale Close, Nelson Avenue and George Street, it has been brought to our attention that there are still a number of issues regarding parking at the beginning and the end of the school day.

Local residents and parents have raised serious concerns about the safety of the children as they walk into school. Amongst the concerns raised were the following:

- 1. Dangerous driving
- 2. Reversing out of a space or along the road when children are still arriving
- 3. Blocking driveways
- 4. Congestion
- 5. Aggressive behaviour towards residents
- 6. Concerns for elderly residents
- 7. Emergency service access
- 8. Children kicking walls and fences
- 9. Parking near corners
- 10. Trespassing on driveways

To help reduce traffic and avoid further near misses please can we ask that where possible parents drop their children at the top of Nelson Avenue and children walk down, therefore helping to reduce the traffic down Nelson Lane and Dale Close. We also ask that parents do not park by the gates of Dale Close, this area will be blocked off by bollards to prevent parking and reversing in that particular spot.

We aim to further reduce congestion once Covid restrictions ease and we are able to invite parents and children to wait on to the playground or inside the field entrance before school and at pick up times.

We would like to remind you that if there are any issues in the future between local residents and parents coming to collect children that this can be reported to the Police on 101 so that they can record this appropriately.

Thank you in advance for your support and understanding. We hope that by working together as a community we can ensure the safety of all the children as they walk to and from school.
