carefully and considered the evidence. In this case, Sam Little was found guilty of cyber bullying!






Global Goals 12 Project

Emily's Charity Donation

On Saturday 10th February Emily had her hair cut off for the Little Princess Trust. The charity was set up by Hannah Tarplee's parents after



she died from a Wilms Tumour. Hannah loved her hair and losing it was very traumatic. When she died in 2005 her parents wanted other children who had lost their hair from cancer or other conditions to be given free wigs.

The Little Princess Trust has helped thousands of young people regain their confidence and identity by giving them a real hair wig. The charity also funds lifesaving research

Safe and Active Schools - Be Bright Be Seen.

Being visible to other road users is important all year round, whether walking, cycling, scooting or wheeling. However, it is especially important during the autumn and winter months when days are shorter and evenings longer.

We can improve our visibility and help drivers and other road users see us

by wearing light, bright and fluorescent clothing or accessories in the day, and reflective clothing or accessories in the evening.

Free School Meal Eligibility

Families who receive the following are eligible for free school meals:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

If you think you may be eligible you can apply at https://www.warwickshire.gov.uk/education-learning/apply-free-school-meals

If your child receives free school meals they are also entitled to Pupil Premium, this is extra funding paid directly to school for each pupil who is eligible. It can help to fund valuable teaching and learning support to improve your child's pupil's education including funding for trips, clubs and music lessons.

This will be a chance for young musicians to be part of a full-size symphony orchestra for the day, play alongside professional musicians, and work on some fantastic music with musicians from other schools in the county.

Places are open to any primary aged children learning an instrument of the orchestra (Violin, Viola, Cello, Double Bass, Trumpet, French Horn, Trombone, Tuba, Percussion, Oboe, Flute, Clarinet or Bassoon). We will be working on music with differentiated parts available for all instruments to accommodate musicians from beginner to grade 5+, so whatever your level, there will be a part for you. 



This course is designed to help families with children to talk and learn about money together.


