

Remember the first letter of each line of the poem should spell out the word 'Egyptians'. The poem also needs to include facts to do with the Ancient Egyptians.


#### Design a holiday poster or leaflet to advertise a trip to Egypt.


You will need to research key places/attractions that people would like to visit and why Egypt is a great place to visit.
