Recognition Awards - March 2019

Staff and pupils representing All Saints' CE Junior School in Warwick were honoured to be invited to the Local Authority's 'Excellence in Education' awards ceremony to recognise the improvements judged by Ofsted in 2017-18. Year 6 pupils, Scarlett and Danny, wrote and delivered a heartfelt speech in which they explained why they thought their school was great.

Mrs Cossins and Mrs Sutherland expressed their delight that the Ofsted inspection recognised that the Personal Development, Behaviour and Welfare at All Saints' is Outstanding. They were very proud of Scarlett and Danny, who represented the staff and pupils of the school so well.



Earth Hour is a worldwide movement organized by the [World Wide Fund for Nature](#) (WWF). The event is held annually encouraging individuals, communities, and businesses to turn off non-essential electric lights, for one hour, from 8:30 to 9:30 p.m. on a specific day towards the end of March, as a symbol of commitment to the planet.^[1] It was started as a lights-off event in [Sydney, Australia](#), in 2007. Since then, it has grown to engage more than 7,000 cities and towns across 187 countries & territories to raise awareness for energy consumption and effects on the environment.

This year's Earth hour was on Saturday 30th March and we were all so impressed with how many households from our school took part in turning off their lights at 8:30pm. Well done!

Please remind your children that they should not be using the adventure play equipment before school. There is no adult supervision if an accident should happen.

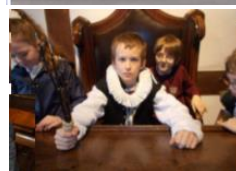
Parking

Miss Letchford's Bo Assembly

We loved welcoming Miss Letchford (from Emscote) into school recently to tell us all about her recent trip to Bo: *'I went to Sierra Leone in February as part of this year's One World Link team. The trip was funded by a British Council grant and the focus of the trip was reducing, reusing and recycling plastic waste. Link schools in both Warwick and Bo have been working on this and making eco-bricks (which are plastic bottles filled with plastic film that cannot be recycled). One of the most interesting (and challenging!) parts of my trip was visiting the schools at New Gerihun Road Lower (linked to Emscote) and Upper (linked to All Saints) and teaching a class of 98 (!) year 6 children about our schools and the recycling work we had been doing. We also took 15 teachers along with 2 pupils from each of the link schools in Bo out on a fieldtrip to look at waste management and recycling in Bo. Needless to say they were already doing a lot to reduce, reuse and recycle their waste and we learnt a lot from them!'*

I'm now really looking forward to June when four teachers from Bo will be visiting Warwick and joining us for 'The Day of the African Child' which will be hosted by All Saints Junior School. Link schools from Warwick and Leamington will all be bringing eco-bricks along to this and we look forward to creating something special with this unique building material!' (Miss Letchford)
