

You can purchase a school coat or use any coat. Please clearly name it. You could put a small keyring somewhere on it if it's a school coat, to help your child find theirs!

P.E. kits will be work to school on their PE days.

Please teach your child independence of doing up their coat zips. We will help them, of course, but it is really helpful once they can be independent. Please clearly name everything!

We put our book bags in boxes away



Please buy a school book bag and name it. You can hang a small keyring from it to help your child identify theirs.

Your child will be given a colour group (red, blue, yellow, orange or green) and keep their book bag in the correct colour box.

Please keep in your child's book bag their reading packet. It needs to be in there daily so that we can always read with them.

Please check book bags every evening as we put letters in them. If you wish to return a letter/slip to school, put it in a TAs hand when they are on the gate at the start of the day, as we do not get time to look through book bags.

We put our water bottles in boxes in our classrooms



We keep our water bottles in a colour box in our classroom.

Water bottles go home daily for a wash and please send your child with water each day. Juice is not allowed.

Please make sure your child can independently open and close their water bottle and that it is clearly named.

We put our lunch boxes on a trolley in the Shared Area



Willow and Cherry lunch boxes go on the same trolley.

Please make sure it is clearly named in case there are others the same!

Please pack a healthy lunch that isn't too big! No nuts or fizzy drinks please.

The start of the day



The teacher takes the register and helps you choose what lunch to have. (A meat or vegetarian option each day on a 3 week rotation – you get a menu so you can help your child choose and send them with a lunch box on the days you think they'd prefer that. We are very flexible with lunches!) Mrs Fawbert often has a school dinner as they are so tasty and she enjoys sitting with the children! More on lunches later...

A typical morning... phonics teaching, playtime, snack time, activity time.







Playtimes and toast! Yummy!



We have bikes and scooters, an adventure playground, wooden train, story chair, toadstools, 'hobbit house' and numerous playground markings to play on.

At morning play your child can have a slice of toast with butter, as a snack. We ask for £1 to be brought in on a Monday and handed to a TA on our Reception gate. This 'pays for the week'!

Milk...





You need to apply online to 'Cool Milk' for your child to receive it. Free until they turn 5 and then you start paying for it.

Afternoons...

Register, maths, activity time, milk and fruit, story and home.

At home time we lead the children to the Outside Area gate and watch them to their parents/carers. To begin with, it takes some time so give us a wave to help speed things up! If someone different is collecting, ideally tell the TA on the gate in the morning or email school.







This is the home corner, craft table and maths area.


















The Willow classroom...








These are the boys' toilets...




The children can go to the toilet whenever they need to, they just need to ask (but if they're desperate just run!)
