Advice

Your child is used to having restrictions and monitoring in place on the devices they use at school. Whilst your child is completing school activities, playing a game, researching an interest, and so on, engage in a conversation with them. Join in their game and ask them who they are chatting too, take an interest in their searches and interests.

Ensure that children are adequately supervised and supported by an adult during any time they are online.
