
Handwriting


To begin, children practise different handwriting patterns.

Tunnel pre-handwriting patterns






















Diagonal pre-handwriting patterns






























Children continue to practise patterns throughout Key Stage 1.

Once children show good pencil control, they are taught the formation of the different letters.

Joining

Once children have mastered the formation, they are taught to join the letters together. This starts with joining phonemes and moves to joining spelling patterns. Joining generally begins at the end of Year 1 or the start of Year 2. This helps to increase speed and fluency in writing.
