Dear Parents and Carers,

Thankfully the Covid cases at Emscote have decreased as rapidly as they increased. Most children and staff are back and we getting back to normal again. Yet again, thanks goes to all of the parents that home schooled, children that went online and embraced it so well – and of course to Mrs Old and Mrs Smith that Zoomed into action without much notice and taught everything from phonics to Yoga! What a smashing community we are all part of.

We have lots of exciting things to look forward to next week and beyond – we have visits planned, visitors coming and... a pizza and ice cream party!

Next week I am meeting the Eco Team. We will be discussing how to save energy, from a environmental point of view – and hopefully reducing the amount you pay in electricity and heating bills.

Please ensure that you are following the most up to date guidance to ensure your child misses a minimal amount of school. Currently, isolation can end following two negative tests on days 5 and 6 (a full 24 hours apart). As soon as the second negative test result is received then your child can return to school, so it is best to test on the morning of both days 5 and 6. Please remember that day zero is the day that symptoms first appear or when a positive test is taken if asymptomatic. If either the day 5 or 6 tests are positive, still keep testing until two negative tests are received 24 hours apart which will allow isolation to end. We understand that positive cases within a family household can cause logistical issues, however please try to arrange for someone else to bring your child to school to reduce the amount of time they are absent from school.

Finally, please can you fill in the questionnaire when you have seen your child's teacher at parents evening, it is a good way for us to understand what is working, and what isn't.

In response to numerous complaints about dog fouling in the area, Warwick District Council's Dog Warden, Vicky Timms has produced the following guidance for dog owners.

The law requires dog owners to clean up after their dog if it fouls in a public place. Dog-waste bins or litter bins can be used for disposal of wrapped faeces, or these can be taken home for disposal. Get into the "Bag It, Bin It – It Only Takes a <u>Minute</u>" habit wherever you go.

### WHERE MUST YOU CLEAN UP?

 \* All pavements, footways, grass verges, roads and gutters, cycle paths, verges both ornamental and grass

 All parks, play areas, gardens, recreation and sports grounds accessible to the public

\* All amenity areas, whether planted, paved, grassed, concreted etc, both in towns and villages.

\* All shopping precincts, pedestrianised areas and car parks.

- \* School playing fields and playgrounds accessible to the public.
- Churchyards and cemeteries.
- \* All footpaths, bridle ways and rights of way
- Canal towpaths, footways and verges.

The message is:

### CLEAN UP AFTER YOUR DOG

(If you don't own the ground, don't leave your dog's mess around!)

### The Council now operate a £50 fixed penalty notice scheme.

You must clean up immediately, not just after fouling has been pointed out to you! Being unaware that your dog fouled, and having no "poop scoop" or bag to pick it up with, are not reasonable excuses for not picking up the mess. You cannot afford to ignore your dog if it fouls. The only exception to the law is for dogs in the charge of people who are registered as being blind.

A fine imposed by magistrates can be as much as £1,000 per single offence.

### FREE SCHOOL MEAL ENTITLEMENT AND PUPIL PREMIUM REGISTRATION

Due to the current situation with COVID-19, we are aware that Parent and Carer's circumstances may have changed. Depending on your family/household income, your child may be eligible for **Free School Meals.** All children in Infant School receive a free hot meal at lunch-time, but this is a separate entitlement.

If your child qualifies for Free School Meals they will also receive **Pupil Premium funding.** This entitles your child to free or subsidised school trips, music lessons, school uniform and help to access after school clubs. Registering children for Free School Meals and subsequently Pupil Premium also enables the school to claim additional funding to improve resources for your child in school.

If you can answer yes to any of the following questions you may be eligible:

- Is your joint family income under £16,190 per year?
- Are you in receipt of any of the **benefits** listed below?
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- •Support from NASS (National Asylum Support Service) under part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- •the guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- •Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190
- •Working Tax Credit run-on
- •Universal Credit.
- Are you or your partner a member of the Armed Forces?

All reception, year 1 and year 2 children in state-funded schools can have a free hot meal at lunchtime. This is known as 'Universal Entitlement'. If you think you are eligible for any of the criteria above we recommend that you still apply. This will mean that your child's school does not miss out on important funding. It may also mean your child will continue to receive free meals after the end of year 2.
