All Saints' Junior School - what does it mean to be a Church school?

Our ethos is that we are fully inclusive of ALL Faiths - and those without a 'Faith'. Through our RE curriculum, children will learn about different World Faiths, including Christianity, and will be encouraged to think about the 'big questions' in life.

Our school Vision (above) has a biblical basis, which may be familiar to many of you - The Parable of the Good Samaritan. This parable underpins our ethos of love, respect, acceptance, religious tolerance, attitudes to people who are 'different', compassion, contemplation about who is a 'neighbour' (including our global neighbours) and how we should we treat others.

Children will learn about the importance of Christian Values such as Thankfulness, Courage, Compassion, Friendship and Respect, amongst others. These are values which all in our school community can appreciate are important life skills and attributes, regardless of faith or belief. At All Saints' these values are at the heart of everything we do and they shape the way in which we guide our children to become good citizens.

We regularly use the image of tree bearing fruit to help children understand the importance of these values; from the strong roots, these Christian values represent the fruit that grows as the teaching is lived out in everyday life. This week, the children have been making 'fruits' to represent these values - many of the children will have brought them home to share with you.

Each half term, we focus on a different value and this time, we are considering the value of Generosity. Attached to the newsletter email is a page with ideas to share with your child at home.

All primary contacts are now set up for Year 3 pupils on Teacher for Parents. Please let the school office know if you have not received a text or email, so we can check the records we hold for you.


School Meals

We would like to remind all parents that school meals must be paid for in advance of meals being taken. Meals cost £2.35 per day, £11.75 per week. Please pay for meals online via www.eduspot.co.uk

All our meals are cooked on site daily by our Educaterers Team, using organic meat, fish from sustainable fisheries, chicken from Red Tractor Assured farms, free range eggs and Fairtrade products. Every day they offer fruit juice cordial, organic semi skimmed milk and a fresh bread basket. Tuck Shop

Tuck shop will now be limited to one item per day and the cost will be a set £1 per week. This should be ordered by the online form as usual but will now be added to the payment system like school dinners and this will be the preferred payment method but cash can still be accepted. At this time there is no option to add credit For tuck so payments should be made weekly.

Lost Reading Books

If your child loses a library book, the cost to replace this is £4.00 or the option to replace the book with an exact copy or another book of the same standard.

Eligibility for Free School Meals and other funding

We know that from time to time circumstances can change and you may find you become eligible for Free School Meals and subsequently Pupil Premium Funding.

Each year our school receives funding from the government called 'Pupil Premium for EACH CHILD registered and this enables us to provide vital extra resources to support those children and in turn, the whole school. This is calculated in October so if you think you could be eligible you should apply now. Should your child be eligible for free school meals you could save up to £400 a year on dinner money as well as a reduction on music fees and trips

If your joint family income is under £16,190 per year and you receive any of the benefits listed below you may be eligible

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support from NASS (National Asylum Support Service) under part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit run-on
- Universal Credit.
