## **Topic:**

#### What's going on this week/notices/information:

**<u>Reading packets:</u>** These have come home today, in your child's book bag. They are all wordless books to begin with, including a laminated card that will give you ideas of discussion, questions and the story. Please really focus on your child recognising and naming the different characters and retelling the story. We have included a worksheet for your child to colour in the characters (using the correct colours for their hair in particular, to help know who is who – there is a coloured picture on the back of the reading diary for you and your child to refer to). Please read with your child at least 4 times a week and record this in their diary. Please make sure their reading packet is kept in their book bag daily so we can hear them read at school.

**Toast:** Thank you to those who have paid for the half term/term. From Monday we will strictly be only giving toast to the children who have paid. Therefore if you only paid £1 for this week then please send £1 or £4 in on Monday so that your child can have toast.
