Year 2 conquer Coventry!

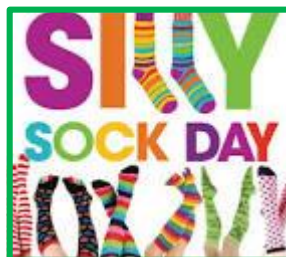
