Dear Parents and Carers,

What a few weeks! We have had 31 positive cases across the school in the last two week, this includes 8 members of staff. As you can imagine this is putting a massive strain on staff in all years. As always the Emscote Team has rallied around, covered classes, lunches duties, breaks, after school and before school clubs and so on. As a result we might not have changed reading books as quickly or answered emails as promptly as before. We are also not in a position to be able to listen to your children reading in class as often as we did, it is essential that you read at least 3 times a week at home – reading only improves with practice. I am hoping that this current wave reduces quickly and we can get back to normal as soon as we can, please continue to lateral flow test and report your results. If your child tests positive please be sure to confirm this with the school office as soon as possible. We are working very hard to keep school open and we would like your support with this.

Thank you for your generous donations to the Tonga Emergency Fund, all donations made to this appeal will go towards funding UNICEF's work to support children in Tonga during the crisis. The children clearly enjoyed being able to help others in need – they also liked learning about volcanoes, ash clouds, lightening storms, pumice islands and tsunamis! Plenty of questions and discussions with the children in assembly and round school – thank you to Wikipedia for all of my answers!!

Sadly our School Council and Eco Council trip to London was cancelled by the Parliament Team, they want to keep the site Covid Safe. We have arranged for all of the children to attend a live virtual tour and a question and answer session on Monday. Needless to say I have written a letter to rearrange it as soon as we can.

Thank you to those parents that attended the Growth Mindset meeting, I had some lovely feedback. The slides will be on the website for those parents that missed it. School Governance Professional (part time)

Warwickshire Governor Services runs a successful clerking service for schools in the county and surrounding area. We wish to recruit additional School Governance Professionals (formerly known as clerk to the governing board) to deliver a high-quality clerking service to schools, to meet demand.

The main duties are:

- providing advice to the governing body on governance, constitutional, and procedural matters.
- providing effective administrative support to the governing body and its committees, including minuting meetings to a high standard.
- ensuring the governing body is properly constituted.
- managing information effectively in accordance with legal requirements.

School Governance Professionals will be employed by Warwickshire County Council but will usually be allocated to specific schools. Day to day accountability is to the governing body.

This is a flexible part-time role, and the hours can be agreed with candidates on an individual basis. Pay (including holiday enhancement) is £12.85 per hour.

You will mainly work from home, with some attendance of meetings at times convenient to the governing body, typically early evening. These are both on-line and in-person meetings (when covid restrictions allow).

We are looking for someone who:

- has good numeracy and excellent written skills, including being able to identify relevant information, take accurate notes at meetings and summarise information to prepare high quality minutes
- is computer literate, especially with Word, web, and email, and has access to equipment for working from home
- is an efficient administrator, able to use initiative and able to work under pressure including meeting deadlines
- can research and manage advice from a variety of sources
- is able to work with detailed information, such as DfE governance regulations and provide detailed and accurate advice
- can support volunteers and lay people in a professional way
- has excellent communications skills, including the ability to liaise, and build effective relationships with senior school staff and support them in a professional way
- understands the importance of confidentiality and integrity
- is willing to work in the evenings
- will undertake CPD and an accreditation programme

School Governance Professionals will receive support, full induction and will be expected to attend the Induction training course, held termly, after appointment. You will also be expected to attend the follow-on Effective Clerking course within the first or second term. Continuing professional development is provided. The role is subject to a DBS check.

FREE SCHOOL MEAL ENTITLEMENT AND PUPIL PREMIUM REGISTRATION

Due to the current situation with COVID-19, we are aware that Parent and Carer's circumstances may have changed. Depending on your family/household income, your child may be eligible for **Free School Meals.** All children in Infant School receive a free hot meal at lunch-time, but this is a separate entitlement.

If your child qualifies for Free School Meals they will also receive **Pupil Premium funding.** This entitles your child to free or subsidised school trips, music lessons, school uniform and help to access after school clubs. Registering children for Free School Meals and subsequently Pupil Premium also enables the school to claim additional funding to improve resources for your child in school.

If you can answer yes to any of the following questions you may be eligible:

- Is your joint family income under £16,190 per year?
- Are you in receipt of any of the **benefits** listed below?
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- •Support from NASS (National Asylum Support Service) under part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- •the guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- •Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190
- •Working Tax Credit run-on
- •Universal Credit.
- Are you or your partner a member of the Armed Forces?

All reception, year 1 and year 2 children in state-funded schools can have a free hot meal at lunchtime. This is known as 'Universal Entitlement'. If you think you are eligible for any of the criteria above we recommend that you still apply. This will mean that your child's school does not miss out on important funding. It may also mean your child will continue to receive free meals after the end of year 2.






