






World Book Day/ Pyjamarama Day

In Science, we have been planting our own seeds and thinking about what they need in order to grow - hopefully they'll start to germinate soon and will be able to be sent home once they've grown a little!






Year 4 Year 4 had fun making jam tarts this week




Year 5




