Today we are sending homework books home. Going forward, we will set homework on a Thursday, to be handed in on a **Monday**. The tasks set will usually be a rotation between topic, maths and phonics. They shouldn't take long for your child to complete and should be enjoyable!

What's going on this week/notices/information:

Playing games: Part of the Early Years curriculum is resilience. One way to practice this, is by playing games: taking turns, waiting for their turn and most importantly losing the game and knowing it's ok!

Name writing: Please help your child write their name using the correct size/height and formation of the letters. E.g. ~~Angela~~ (The capital letter is tall. The g descends below the line and the l is tall. The other letters are all the same height. All the letters sit on the line, rather than flying high!) See the letter formation sheet attached as it would be useful for the children to practice all their letter formation as it will help them with their writing in phonics.
