Spring Term Colour Creations

Key Vocabulary

Colour What we see when we look at things, like red, blue, or yellow.

Primary Colours Red, yellow and blue are primary colours. They can't be made by mixing other colours.

Secondary Colours Orange, green and purple are secondary colours. They are made by mixing two primary colours together.

Mix To stir or blend colours together.

Shades These are created by adding black to a colour. This makes a colour darker.

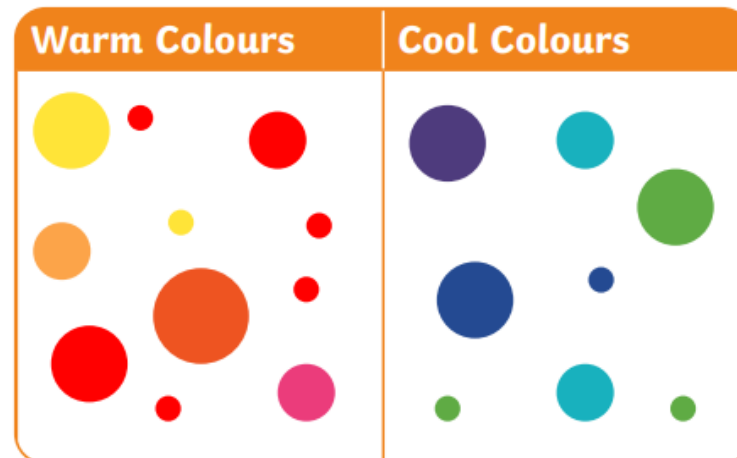
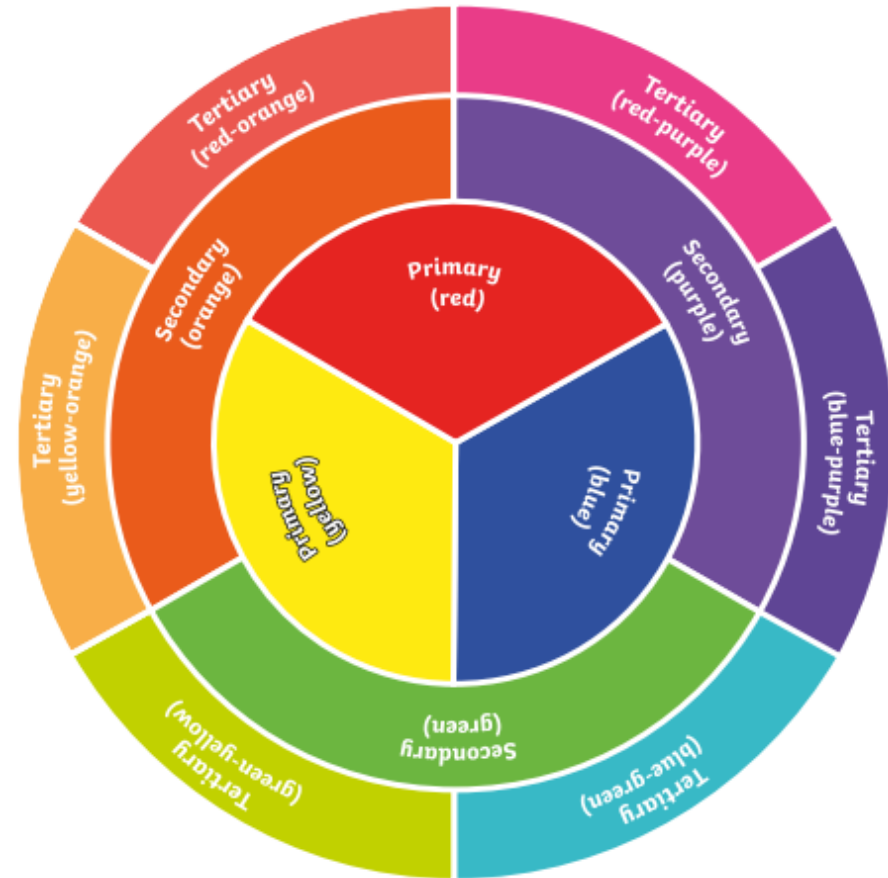
Light A colour made lighter by adding white.

Colour Wheel A circle that shows how colours fit together.

Pattern A design that repeats, like stripes or spots.

Shape The outline of something — like a circle, square, or triangle.

Artist A person who makes art such as paintings, drawings or sculptures.

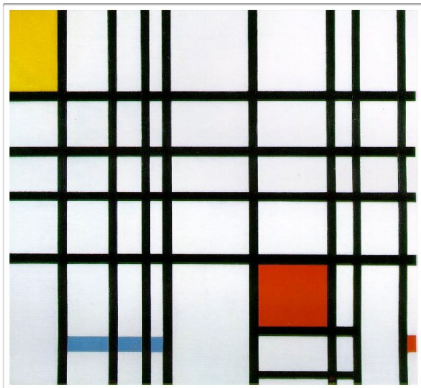


Artists

Piet Mondrian (1872-1944) Mondrian liked to paint using the primary colours with black lines and white spaces.

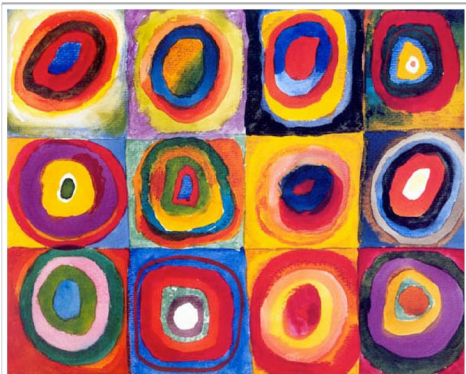


Wassily Kandinsky (1866-1944) Kandinsky was one of the first painters to stop painting pictures of things and just use colours and shapes.



This piece is called **Composition with Red Yellow and Blue**.

Mondrian painted it in 1921



This is one of Kandinsky's most famous works of art. It is called **Colour Studies: Squares with Concentric Circles**.

He painted it in 1913.

Colour Mixing

Red and blue make purple.

 +  = 
Yellow and red make orange.

 +  = 
Blue and yellow make green.

 +  +  = 
Red and blue and yellow make brown.

 +  = 
White and red make pink.

 +  = 
White and black make grey.
