February Half Term Bikeability Holiday Courses - Fully Funded Training

All courses are run by first aid and safeguarding trained National Standard Instructors. The Level 1 & 2 course runs over two consecutive days from 10.00am – 2.30pm (4 hours of training per day) with a 30 minute supervised lunch break. WCC has loan cycles available for any child who does not have access to their own.

Children receive a realistic cycling experience equipping them with the skills to cycle short local journeys on-road. We educate riders on effective observations, understanding road priorities, communicating with other road users and effective road positioning. **These are fully funded for residents of Warwickshire.**
