
What is the difference between human geography and physical geography?

Physical geography looks at the physical structure and workings of the natural world, including mountains, seas, oceans, rivers, continents, landforms, glaciers, weather and climates.



Human geography explores the people, communities and cultures of the world. This includes looking at different types of settlements, economics, populations, health, life expectancy and other ways in which human activity impacts the world.


