Assessment for learning – Next week

We have been so impressed with the way in which your children have engaged with remote learning over recent weeks and would like to congratulate them for their hard work. When children are physically in class, teachers are always informally assessing how they are getting on through observing them at work, looking through books, etc, then adjusting their lesson planning accordingly. As this isn't currently possible, we have decided to explore other avenues.

We are therefore planning for all children to complete the following, next week:

a Star Reading Test from Accelerated Reader (normally completed in school) an online maths assessment

It is essential that the children complete these independently. We are not setting these assessments to find out what level or stage your child is working at - we can complete that sort of test when they return to school. These assessments will identify gaps in learning to enable teachers to adjust their plans. For example, they may discover that their class needs to spend a little extra time learning about a concept or calculation in maths. You'll understand that if children are helped by you to achieve a correct answer, it does not help the teacher to gain an overview of learning. All of our children are used to completing tests in school - we simply encourage them to try their best, as we know you will. As always, we are looking at ways in which we can improve the provision for your children, especially as there may be weeks of remote learning ahead. Continued overleaf....













These assessments will be completed in one of the online lesson slots - your child's class teacher will introduce it and explain what to do. Please see timetables for next week and information from your year group staff.

Adjustments to Remote learning timetable after half term:

PE:

Thank you to all of those who completed our online questionnaire. The outcomes show that most of you agree that it would be a good idea to remove an afternoon slot to enable exercise or PE to be completed at home. After half term, we will therefore finish remote lessons at the end of the morning every Friday. If you as a family wish to go out for a walk together or do other exercise together, this will provide flexibility to do so. If this is not possible, we will be sending links to online PE lessons for your child to complete at home.

Those attending school will have PE during Friday afternoon and school will finish for them at 3.15pm as usual.

End of the day session changes - after half term

You will probably all be aware that this week is National Children's Mental Health week. One of the key difficulties of remote learning is that, despite academic work continuing, we completely understand that children will be missing their friends and might be struggling with all of the restrictions they are living under. Therefore, we are going to dedicate the final session of the day to a combination of assembly, PSHE/citizenship and a chance for children to talk to each other across the week. To allow sufficient time for this, the Y3 and 4 session will start slightly earlier (after half term), as follows:

Y5 & 6 - 2.30pm Y3 & 4 - 2.45pm

Test and Trace Support Payment Scheme

You could be eligible for a £500 Test and Trace Support Payment if you live in England and meet all the following criteria:

- You've been told to stay at home and self-isolate by NHS Test and Trace or the NHS COVID-19 app, either because you have tested positive for coronavirus or have recently been in close contact with someone who has tested positive
- you've responded to messages received from NHS Test and Trace and have provided any legally required information
- you're employed or self-employed
- you're unable to work from home and will lose income as a result of self-isolating
- you're currently receiving or are the partner of someone in the same household who is receiving, at least one of the following benefits:

Universal Credit Working Tax Credit income-based Employment and Support Allowance income-based Jobseeker's Allowance Income Support Housing Benefit Pension Credit

If you're not on one of these benefits, you could be eligible for a £500 discretionary payment if all the following apply:

- you meet all the other criteria listed above
- you're on a low income
- you will face financial hardship as a result of self-isolating

You can make a claim for the Test and Trace Support Payment scheme or a discretionary payment up to 28 days after the first day of your period of self-isolation.

If you're eligible for either the Test and Trace Support Payment or a discretionary payment, you will receive the £500 payment on top of any benefits and Statutory Sick Pay that you currently receive.
