Parking and Drop off

Year 4 Little Christmas Jumpers.

The Year 4 children showed off their sewing skills at the Warwick Christmas Tree Festival held at St Mary's Church in December. To keep with our own tradition of recycling and trying to make as little environmental impact as possible, all of the materials used to create our Christmas jumpers have been reclaimed from various items and various households. They have been created with a view to be reused and once they have finished sparkling at the Christmas tree festival, they will be taken home and hung on our trees. Hopefully they will continue to be displayed at Christmas for years to come.



Reducing Plastic Waste Assembly

We were visited by Ruth from Warwickshire County Council, she came to talk to us about plastic waste (in

particular, single-use plastic). She gave us some shocking statistics about the rate of decay of single-use plastic and demonstrated the lengthy process used to create plastic. She discussed ideas for ways in which we can reduce our use of plastic and help to protect our planet. We used this as an opportunity to talk about some of the writing that we have been doing across the school, regarding plastic and the environment (Year 3 talked about their letters to Tesco about plastic packaging and Year 5 about letters they have written to Matt Western - our local MP - about Climate Change and plastic).

We then reminded ourselves of all the plastic we recycle in school and the work that is carried out by both the Eco.



World Book Day is coming up on Thursday 7th March and we're keen to use it to help encourage reading for pleasure amongst our children. We'd love all children to take part in one of the dressing up options on the day but **please do not go out and spend money on a fancy costume.**

Research shows that children see each other's costumes as a book recommendation tool so these suggestions might help us to promote and encourage reading for pleasure:



- Children can come dressed as their favourite book character, bringing their chosen book if possible
- Some children may prefer not to come fully dressed up but come with props which represent their favourite book
- Children who prefer non-fiction books may like to use tabards or T-shirts with top facts or illustrations or might dress up as the subject of the non-fiction book
- Those who don't like dressing up can come in non-uniform but preferably still bring a book of their choice

Rocksteady Concert

We are lucky enough to have Rock Steady at All Saints' every Tuesday morning working with children across the whole school. They have the opportunity to learn either bass, electric lead guitar, keyboard, drums or vocals. They then work together to practise songs which are



performed by each band to the whole school at the end of each term. They had to work on their rhythm, timing, composition and collaboration of instruments to create an enjoyable performance and piece of music.

Free School Meals Eligibility

We know that from time to time circumstances can change and you may find you become eligible for Free School Meals and subsequently Pupil Premium Funding.

Each year our school receives funding from the government called 'Pupil Premium for EACH CHILD registered and this enables us to provide vital extra resources to support those children and in turn, the whole school.

Should your child be eligible for free school meals you could save up to £400 a year on dinner money as well as a reduction on music fees and trips etc.

If your joint family income is under £16,190 per year and you receive any of the benefits listed below you may be eligible

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support from NASS (National Asylum Support Service) under part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- · The guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit run-on
- Universal Credit.


Cygnets
