Dear Parents/Carers,

Thank you to those families who recently took the time to sign up to the MY-CATS programme, which is aimed at helping reduce anxiety and identify confidence issues in young children. We would also like to add that if your child is struggling or they have specific concerns about school, please share these worries with us. If you need a conversation with your child's teacher, please contact the office and they will arrange for the teacher to talk to you over the phone. I would urge you to talk to us about concerns as they arise and to avoid airing them on social media and/or WhatsApp. The latter can cause undue anxiety amongst other parents/carers and it is important that our staff are aware of any issues in order to address them.

In preparation for the Easter holidays, the local authority and Public Health Warwickshire have asked us to inform parents that they should keep in touch with school regarding coronavirus infections over the Easter break.

Any child who falls ill with any of the 3 main symptoms should still be tested over the holiday. This does mean self-isolation as a family until a negative result is received. It is imperative that we are able to inform other parents if a child falls ill with symptoms and needs to be tested. In terms of tracing we need to know if any child has symptoms and is being tested **up to midnight on Saturday Evening (3rd April).** School leaders have been asked by the government to be available to assist with tracing contacts during the Easter holidays.

Please text the Federation **Covid phone 07732 387372** with any new symptoms or positive results. We will contact you via email should there be any need for your child to isolate.

Once again, thank you for your continued support this term and we wish you all a very happy Easter.


Fundraising for Red Nose Day

Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Programme



The Department for Education (DfE) has made funds available to every local authority in England to coordinate free holiday provision, including healthy food and enriching activities. The programme will cover the Easter, summer and Christmas holidays in 2021.

The funding is for children who receive benefits-related free school meals (Reception to Year 11). In addition to the HAF programme, Warwickshire County Council will separately be providing the Winter Grant scheme payment to eligible families for the Easter holidays.



FREE SCHOOL MEAL ENTITLEMENT AND PUPIL PREMIUM REGISTRATION

Due to the current situation with COVID-19, we are aware that Parent and Carer's circumstances may have changed. Depending on your family/household income, your child may be eligible for **Free School Meals.** All children in Infant School receive a free hot meal at lunch-time, but this is a separate entitlement.

If your child qualifies for Free School Meals they will also receive **Pupil Premium funding.** This entitles your child to free or subsidised school trips, music lessons, school uniform and help to access after school clubs. Registering children for Free School Meals and subsequently Pupil Premium also enables the school to claim additional funding to improve resources for your child in school.

If you can answer yes to any of the following questions you may be eligible:

- •Is your joint family **income** under £16,190 per year?
- Are you in receipt of any of the **benefits** listed below?
- •Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- •Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- •Support from NASS (National Asylum Support Service) under part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- •the guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- •Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit run-on
- Universal Credit.
- Are you or your partner a member of the **Armed Forces**?

All reception, year 1 and year 2 children in state-funded schools can have a free hot meal at lunchtime. This is known as 'Universal Entitlement'. If you think you are eligible for any of the criteria above we recommend that you still apply. This will mean that your child's school does not miss out on important funding. It may also mean your child will continue to receive free meals after the end of year 2.
