

<p>Daily writing ideas.</p>	<p>Complete the following tasks in your own time:</p> <p>In literacy, we were looking at the Shakespearian play 'Romeo and Juliet'. Here are some ideas of how you could do this:</p> <p>Use a storyboard template to summarise the main events (including the main parts and key characters)</p> <div style="text-align: right;">  </div>	<p>You could record your work on paper, Microsoft Word or on Purple Mash. Challenge: Can you edit your work when you have finished to improve it?</p> <p>Another idea:</p> <p>Use the Pobble365 website (www.pobble365.com). Each day there will be a NEW picture. Have a careful look at the picture. You could write a story based on this image. There will be a 'Story Starter' for you to use if you wish.</p>											



- **Design a comic strip**

You can do this on purple mash by typing in the search bar 'blank comic book' or you could just print off a comic strip template online or from twinkl for you to fill in.

- **Write up your version of the story using paragraphs** (Remember techniques to include: good openers, adjectives, range of punctuation e.g. inverted commas, range of sentence lengths etc.)
- **Create your own video/rap/song**

Focus on the x4 table this week. Play the game at least ten times recording your score each time. Try to remember more and more table facts and you should see your





Accessing Purple Mash set tasks through welearn365.

1. Log on to your welearn account (using the same password as your school computer).

Click on **Resources**.

2. When on the 'Resources' page, click on the **Purple Mash** icon.

3. Once on Purple Mash, click on the **search** tab at the top of the page and type in the task I have set above.
