Monday	Map of the United Kingdom		
	On the map of the United Kingdom (UK) on p3, we would like you to label		
	and colour the countries of England, Scotland, Northern Ireland and		
	Wales. Also, find and label the capital cities - London, Edinburgh,		
	Belfast and Cardiff. Can you find where Warwick would be too?		
	The Queen lives in one of the capital cities - what is the name of the		
	palace that she lives in and the name of the city?		
	As a challenge, mark on other places that you have visited in the UK		
	and/or name some of the seas that surround the UK?		
Tuesday	Union Jack Flag		
	The flag of the United Kingdom is called		
	the Union Jack and is made up of flags		
	from each country that make up the UK.		
	Using a ruler, carefully recreate a Union		
	Jack flag and colour it in correctly.		
	You could also have fun creating your		
	own family flag of your own design and colour!		
Wednesday	If you were King or Queen for the Day!		
	We would like you to have fun thinking about what it would be like if you		
	were King or Queen for the day!		
	What would you do if you were king or queen?		
	What would your name be? Would you make up new rules? Would you		
	change the world? Or would you have a fun day doing as you please? Do		
	you think you would like it? Write about what you might do!		
Thursday	Design and make a crown		
	On a sheet of paper, design a crown for yourself as king or queen and		
	label the drawing with the materials, colours and jewels that you would		
	need to make it. Once you've designed your crown, you can then create		
	your own if you have the resources at home.		
	Challenge: Discuss with a grown up how you could work out the size of		
	your head in centimetres, so your crown fits perfectly!		

Friday	Special Commemorative Stamp Design
	The Queen is on many postage stamps and
	special stamps are also created for different
	occasions. To celebrate the work of the NHS,
	your task today is to design a stamp to celebrate
	the amazing work of the National Health Service
	(NHS) during this time. There is a stamp
	template on p4 to help you if you would like.
	You may want to add rainbows, the NHS logo,
	pictures of doctors/nurses, positive messages of thanks - it's up to you!

## Maths Extra Activity – measuring in centimetres:

Using a ruler or tape measure, we would like you to practise measuring different objects around your house. You could compare the sizes using the more than > and less than < or same as = signs! Remember to start measuring from 'Ocm'.
